CORNELIUS O'BRIEN LECTURE SERIES SUSAN TUNICK, TERRA COTTA SCHOLAR

Susan Tunick, President of Friends of Terra Cotta and living in New York City, presented lectures to our community about the history of architectural terra cotta, manufacturing techniques, and the importance of terra cotta in architectural history. Ms. Tunick led a walking tour pointing out terra cotta treasures in our own Downtown Lafayette. Mr. Herget, President of Arsee Engineers, Inc led a workshop in testing terra cotta and suggested practices for maintenance



and repair. The following day, Ms. Tunick made a presentation at the West Lafayette Public Library on Louis Sullivan designed banks and conducted a site visit to our com-



munity's own Louis Sullivan band building in the Village of WL. WVTHP received a Historic Preservation Education Grant to develop the guide, "A Lafayette Handbook for Architectural Glazed Terra Cotta".

An autographed copy of one of Ms. Tunick's publications, <u>Terra Cotta Skyline</u>, is now a part of the Trust's library and is available at the Graves House.
